Patty Mayall of La Honda says she was informed by Caltrans that the spraying was taking place on Monday, despite a weekend of rain and more in the forecast. Residents and water quality experts worry that wet conditions will send the toxic herbicides into water supplies. Caltrans officials have not returned emails or calls from the Almanac asking for comment on the spraying...

On July 26, San Mateo County supervisors Don Horsley and Dave Pine, the two members of the Board of Supervisors' Environmental Quality Committee, agreed to hire consultants to report to the county about how it can control weeds using as few chemicals as possible. Until that report comes back, the two supervisors asked that all broadcast spraying be stopped..."

However in High school, it was the Grateful Dead that showed him how someone could play multiple styles. Listening to the Dead he picked up on Blues, Country, Jazz, and Bluegrass. A couple of Bundy's first bands were Wild Mountain Jam and The Mackey Brothers. Bundy got his authentic blues education by playing with the Deacon Jones band for a year. Deacon Jones was the keyboard player for John Lee Hooker. Now I understand why Bundy has the authentic blues sound. Bundy plays close to home these days since the club scene has been depressed for awhile now. He can be seen regularly at all the local venues. It looks like there will be a Bundy Browne CD out sometime soon. He has been recording with the members of one of his old bands, Old Browne Shoe. He calls it the 30 year overdue album. There should be a second CD out shortly thereafter with his current band. You can find Bundy's music on Reverb Nation or catch him live on December 10th at AppleJack's or at Cafe Cuesta on December 17th. Bundy is an accomplished guitarist and mandolin player. His vocals are smooth as silk. You could see shows like his around the Bay Area and spend lots of money but why? Catch Bundy right here locally for free.

Reflecting on Reflection Lake

The name "Reflection Lake" conjures images of a limpid pool, but this fall, the lake has been more likely to conjure thoughts of a sewer: Warm October and November days brought on an algae bloom and a related smell.

Recent rain has raised the water level and cut down on the smell, but questions remain: Would deepening the lake reduce the algae and smell? Would removing some of the lily pads and cattails or tule weeds around the pond's edges improve the pond? Should the pond be allowed to gradually fill in with silt, becoming a meadow?

The Resource Conservation District of San Mateo County can help Cuesta La Honda Guild decide what steps to take to achieve any of these objectives, said RDC Executive Director Kellyx Nelson to the Guild's fall General Membership Meeting. First, however, the Guild will need to sketch out for the District a vision for the lake's future uses.

The Guild's water rights allow for the lake to be used for fire suppression and recreation — but will the lake be managed for bird-watching or swimming or some other form of recreation?

La Honda utility sees costly repairs

“One of the smallest utilities in San Mateo County, La Honda CSA-7 could be facing millions of dollars in repair work to upgrade an aging waterworks mostly built in the 1920s.

The full slate of suggested repairs would cost about \$19,000 per person in the district, according to one agency's numbers. Managed by San Mateo County, the small water district serves an estimated 180 people on the south side of La Honda, including Camp Glenwood and Sam McDonald County Park. Independent reports depict a deteriorating water system that sometimes loses pressure or ceases to provide water entirely during heavy use... However, the La Honda water system's customer advisory committee has considered the more costly repairs with some mixed skepticism. If implemented, the full package of recommendations would amount to building an entirely new water system, said committee chairwoman Patricia O'Neal. "We're not in a position to jump up and build a new system," she said. "It's not realistic. There's no crisis other than perhaps a series of bureaucratic events."...In either case, the outcome could mean an increase in water rates for La Honda customers, who haven't seen a change in rates for more than 10 years." (Note: this is **not** the Cuesta La Honda water system)

Book captures neighbors coming together

South Coast Pastor's Story of Compassion

"It actually started very simply - with a few words of greeting from a church porch. The woman doing the greeting was Pescadero Community Church pastor Wendy Taylor, saying hello in Spanish to the Spanish-speaking workers as they trudged home from the fields.

The men shared with the pastor something of their lives and the needs of their largely unseen community.

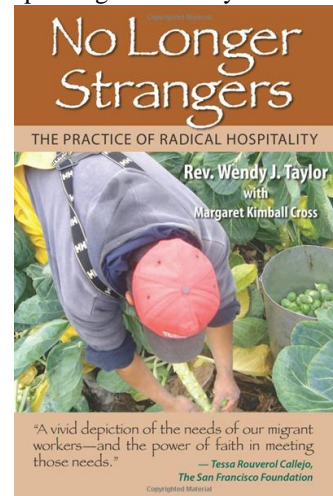
Pastor Taylor responded by creating **Puente (meaning "bridge") de la Costa Sur.**

That set in motion a response from the English-speaking community, who embraced the men and helped them find basic necessities and comforts.

Along with writer and award-winning community activist Margaret Kimball Cross, Taylor brings that story out in "No Longer Strangers: The Practice of Radical Hospitality" (Baker and Taylor, 250 pages paperback, \$14.95) and available through amazon.com.

It tells of "community acceptance and the transformation of a community to treat the workers as part of the family," said Taylor by phone from Ocean Shores, Wash., her home since 2009 with wife, Ellen...

The book follows the 1998 inception of Puente and its development helping the Spanish-speaking community...



The men were primarily year-round workers who lived in Pescadero, Loma Mar, **La Honda** and San Gregorio. ... "I hope we manage to bring a model of radical hospitality, where we are kind and respectful of each other," she

said. "This community started not knowing each other and now (are) consciously accepting of the laborers and their families."

Puente now has 18 employees and handles summer youth programs, classes, health and legal assistance and "La sala," a "community living room" for the men.

"I'm really grateful," said Taylor. "It seems like a dream sometimes."...

She also has scheduled some events focused on the book around the Bay Area: 11:15 a.m. on Nov. 13 at the Ladera Community Church in Portola Valley and at noon on Nov. 20 at the Congregational Church of Belmont.

"Anything can happen for good," Taylor said."

Tour of Pigeon Point Lighthouse

Perched on a cliff on the central California coast, 50 miles south of San Francisco, the 115-foot Pigeon Point Lighthouse, one of the tallest lighthouses in America, has been guiding mariners since 1872. Its five-wick lard oil lamp, and first-order Fresnel lens, comprised of 1,008 prisms, was first lit at sunset, November 15, 1872. The lens stands 16 feet tall, 6 feet in diameter, and weighs 8,000 pounds. It sits in a lantern room that had been constructed at the Lighthouse Service's general depot in New York before being shipped around the Horn. Although the original Fresnel lens is no longer in use, the lighthouse is still an active U.S. Coast Guard aid to navigation using a 24 inch Aero Beacon. Beginning at 10:30AM, La Honda resident and Pigeon Point docent, Peter Bohacek, will be our guide on today's tour. Bring a bag lunch and, weather permitting, we can picnic afterwards. We'll carpool from the La Honda Post Office at 9:30AM sharp. Please call or email if you would like to attend.

Restoration begins at Pigeon Point Lighthouse

“After 10 years of rust, deterioration and collapse, Pigeon Point Lighthouse, one of California's most spectacular historic coastal landmarks, is finally on the road to recovery.

In the first major step toward an \$11 million renovation of the stately, white brick structure located south of Pescadero on the San Mateo County coast, skilled workers from across the United States have spent the past two weeks painstakingly unbolting, removing and disassembling the 2,000-pound Fresnel lens from the top of the lighthouse and renovating it at a building on the site.

It is the first time since the lighthouse was built in 1871 that its lens - - a complex network of 1,008 glass prisms hand-built in 1860s Paris, shaped like a beehive and rotated on a brass assembly like a grandfather clock -- has been removed. ...





The lens, whose light came first from pig lard then kerosene then 1,000-watt electric bulbs, was made obsolete in 1972 after radar, LORAN and now global positioning systems started providing new ways for sailors to navigate the rocky coast.

Yet the 115-foot-tall lighthouse remains a draw for more than 100,000 visitors a year. ... Pigeon Point is the tallest lighthouse on the West Coast, tied for that distinction with Point Arena Lighthouse in Mendocino County.



In 2001, things turned dangerous. State parks officials, who have managed the site since 1980, closed the lighthouse that year to tours after two large pieces of brick and iron fell from the top of the building. Over time, the salty sea air has caused relentless corrosion... When sufficient money is raised, the next step will be to have International Chimney, a Buffalo, N.Y. company that specializes in lighthouse restoration, remove the upper third of the structure, shore it up with new steel bands and bracing and rebuild it with the original bricks...”

Deputies recapture boys who escaped from La Honda correctional facility

The boys, who live in San Francisco, got into a waiting car outside Log Cabin Ranch about 8:10 p.m. and sped away. Sheriff's deputies located the vehicle, described as a dark-colored Buick, shortly thereafter near the ranch, a rehabilitation center

for delinquent youths...



The boys were charged with escaping from custody and conspiracy and booked into the county Youth Services Center. The women -- Rokesha Pineda, 21, of San Francisco; Angelica Pineda, 19, of San Francisco; and Kelvina Burton, 18, of Antioch -- were charged with aiding and abetting an escape and conspiracy and booked into San Mateo County jail."

Workers to fix Pescadero's oldest buildings - Native Son's Hall, St. Anthony's

"Like some biblical miracle, two of the oldest buildings in Pescadero will literally levitate off the ground this week - albeit with the help of jacks, supports and a team of engineers. Not quite an act divine

intervention, a hired team of workers is raising the Native Son's Community Hall and St. Anthony's Mission for a round of foundation repairs that just happen to be occurring around the same time. Each more than 120 years old, the two churches are sinking on their respective plots for different reasons, but both are simultaneously undergoing a round of repairs thanks to small-town gumption and years of patient fundraising....The building was originally built in 1890 as a branch of the Methodist Episcopal church, which disbanded about 25 years later, some say after the priest went broke and skipped town. In the following years, the vacant building served whatever role Pescadero townfolk needed, functioning as a theater, gaming room, dance hall, library and health clinic...In the years preceding World War II, the hall housed a cultural center for local Japanese immigrants to study language and martial arts. The Native Sons and Native Daughters of the Golden West acquired the building in 1942 and it became a sort of hunting lodge for local farmers while also serving as a community center..."

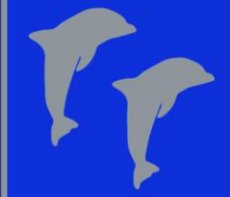
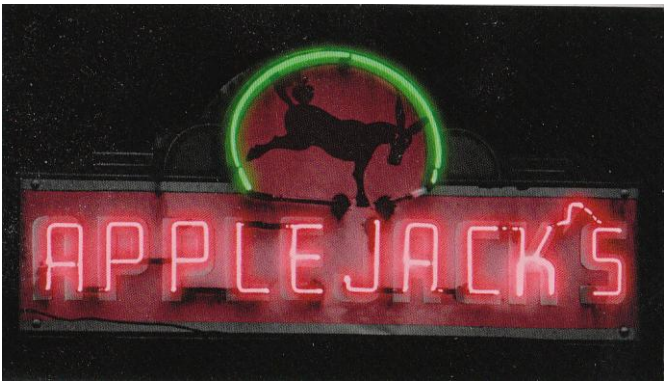

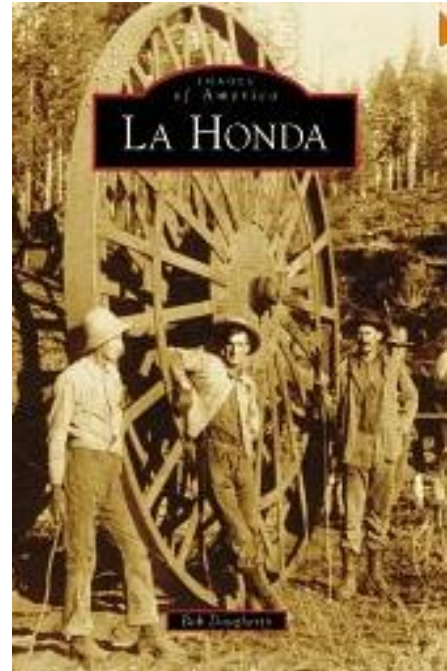
