Coastside School Districts Prepare for Teacher Layoffs

“... the Cabrillo Unified School District in Half Moon Bay and the La Honda-Pescadero Unified School District will likely approve a number of cutbacks they say are the result of California's unprecedented fiscal crisis. They also fear the pain is just beginning... at La Honda-Pescadero Unified, which in March made a round of cuts that included scaling back the hours of a math and art teacher at Pescadero High and two intervention counselors. On Thursday, the trustees are expected to shorten the hours of the after-school director, who lost grant funding when the district's enrollment declined.

La Honda-Pescadero has been scraping by, funding three school sites with a minuscule \$4.9 million budget, thanks in large part to a federal school performance grant that came through just in time last summer. The money allowed the district to hire a new school principal, extend its

hours and start summer school classes this July, according to Superintendent Amy Wooliever. But the California Department of Education has told both Coastside school districts to prepare for a per-pupil cut of between \$350 and \$800 per student, depending on the final budget numbers this summer.

...Next year will see more cuts, according to Gaskill. How big they are will depend on developments in Sacramento that are beyond the control of local school districts...”

You're invited to join La Honda hams (the SC4 Amateur Radio Club) June 25th and 26th at La Honda Gardens for Field Day 2011. Each year, ham radio operators around the country set up stations in fields, parks and malls to practice emergency communications. Beginning at noon Saturday and continuing for 24 hours, licensed hams AND members of the community will practice their skills in emergency communications by attempting to contact radio operators around the world.

Featured again this year is the Get-On-The-Air (GOTA) station, an opportunity for everyone from the community to try out their skills in radio communication. No license is needed, just stop by the booth and check it out. Also at the GOTA station will be demonstrations of various ham radio equipment and hobbies including computer communications, low power rigs, "fox hunting" and more.

"We formed this ham radio club five years ago to teach emergency communication skills to the people who live in the rugged rural mountains here – where the first responders to disasters will likely be them" says Emergency Coordinator Jack Eddy. ..Stop by La Honda Gardens June 25th/26th – see what it's all about and meet your local hams. You'll probably recognize some as your neighbors! We'll also have a booth at the La Honda Fair in June. This fun and easy means of communication not only provides information during storms and road closures, it could someday save a life when other means of communication are not available. Harleys and Holy Water: Blessing of the Motorcycles

"Nearly every Sunday during Mass at Our Lady of Refuge Mission in **La Honda** on the San Mateo County coast, the quiet sanctity of the liturgy is pierced by a siren's shrill wail -- a serious accident, usually involving a motorcycle, has taken place on one of the winding roads that snake their way through the Santa Cruz Mountains..."

Last Saturday, May 21, ...the two deacons launched into a special blessing extolling the beauty, as well as the responsibilities, of the sport...Dan Cissell and Sandee Lehner, both from nearby Skyline, rode up on their Harleys. Mark McGhee, Deacon McGhee's son, arrived from Pescadero on his Kawasaki. Parishioner Joel Mansfield, who rode from his home in San Francisco to take part in the event, showed up on his 1998 Honda Valkyrie. Parishioners Shella Bordi and Elizabeth Hardy didn't have motorcycles, but they were there to help with the event.

...Outside the church, Joel Mansfield turned hot dog links on the barbecue. A retired police officer with the city of Berkeley, Mansfield met his wife, Angela, while working as a lifeguard at the public swimming pool in La Honda in 1970. Although they now live in San Francisco, they have remained supportive of Our Lady of Refuge throughout their marriage. Along with their son, John, a student at UC-Berkeley, they formed Mansfield Family Music, a family trio which also performs at Church of the Epiphany in San Francisco..."

Three weddings and a quinceñera have been booked between June and September of this year. Our rainy spring didn't have a lot to do with it, though. It's been a group effort. Parishioners have been working at the church every Thursday since the first of the year to polish the inside of the church and plan, prune and plant in order to prepare the church grounds...

Church members thought that the wooded yet sunny rural location might be attractive to Catholics from outside the parish who were looking for an intimate setting for their wedding ceremony. So they placed an ad in the wedding edition of the archdiocese newspaper, *Catholic San Francisco*...



The Thursday work days were organized by Joel and Angela Mansfield, who have shown up faithfully every week, rain or shine. There's always work to do, inside or outside... Shella Bordi is planning the landscaping, sometimes



working with what is already there and carefully adding drought tolerant and deer resistant plants to new areas. The beds flanking the entrance steps have been completely replanted and are already adding color to the entrance with blooms of lavender, California poppies, white and purple osteospermum and golden feverfew. The rose garden is being transformed into a meditation garden with the addition of new roses and other flowers as well as a bench. When the vines climbing the fence fill in, the garden area will also provide a backdrop for wedding

pictures... The church has no social hall but Joel Mansfield has compiled a wedding brochure that includes resources for local reception venues and tent and dance floor rentals for an on-site reception. It's been a labor of love and a community effort that will continue in order to maintain the beauty of our local church and its grounds. Our Lady of Refuge, off the main roads, tucked away in the woods, is really a hidden gem.

Cuesta 2011 Pool Season

Hey swimmers! Welcome to the 2011 Pool Season. We hope to have another safe and successful summer at the Cuesta La Honda Guild pool.



There are a few changes to be aware of: Group pool passes for the season now are for up to six people, but the group pass includes 10 guest passes. For Guild members the group pass is still free, and for non-Guild members the price for a group pool pass is \$298. (\$49. for additional people on a group pass.) The day guest pass rate is still \$7. and a booklet of 10 guest passes is \$60., and for children two years old and under the rate is \$3.

All prospective patrons need to fill out all appropriate paperwork before using the pool. That means agreeing to abide by the pool rules. All children and after hours swimmers need to pass the swim test before getting in the pool. A swim test involves swimming across the pool and back under lifeguard supervision - and the lifeguard must approve the swimmers ability.

Parents, of course you know that you are responsible for your children. They should know the pool rules and follow them. Children 10 years of age and non-swim and under - and non-swimmers - must be accompanied by an adult. Non-swimmers must stay in the shallow end, and an adult needs to be within arms length. Lifeguards are not babysitters and they have a variety of responsibilities! If there is a "Code Brown" (poop in the pool), all swimmers must get out of the pool - so parents, please practice proper swim diaper management. Important: All pool patrons need to follow the instructions of the lifeguards!

We would also like to improve the signing in process. When you come to the pool, please sign in with your first and last name - and the names of all the people with you. Please indicate whether you are Guild member, Non-Guild member, paying visitor, or guest. Write your time in, and if possible, your time out. We hope to adjust our staffing and maintenance schedules based on pool use, so your signing in appropriately is important.

We are also looking for your help. If you would like to be involved in sprucing up the pool area or helping to fix up our facility, please let me know. Or, if you would like to discuss swim lessons or swim activities, if you have ideas about providing sunscreen and pool equipment, please talk to our lifeguard staff. If you have any suggestions for improving the pool area or pool policies and practices, please let us know.

Last year, inspectors claimed our pool was one of the best maintained pools in San Mateo County! Our Public Works staff does an outstanding job keeping the water perfect. Last year, our lifeguards made two saves and maintained the peace and harmony of our pool culture. The lifeguard staff hopes to continue a perfect safety record and to make the pool experience pleasant for everyone. Your help with these endeavors is essential so that we can all enjoy another great summer pool season in La Honda.

Please review the pool rules. If you have any questions about the pool rules or policies, please let us know: Linda Meehan, the Head Lifeguard, Sylvie Paris and Kathy Wolf, Assistant Head Lifeguards, any of our excellent Lifeguard staff, or myself, Randy Vail, Recreation Director.

1 Dead, 5 Hurt after Pickup Flips near La Honda

(excerpt from <http://www.sfgate.com/cgi-bin/article.cgi?f=/c/a/2011/05/26/BA361JLT73.DTL&tsp=1>) “... a pickup truck carrying seven people flipped over and tumbled down a hill, flinging victims as it rolled. One person, Luis Audelo-Partida, 26, of Newark, was killed, two were seriously injured and three others suffered minor injuries during the crash in a remote, rugged woodland area of the Santa Cruz Mountains near **La Honda**. The victims were all workers who had been contracted by the Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District to do weed abatement work in the preserve... The vehicle apparently spun around, tipped over and then rolled several hundred feet down a steep hillside in a canyon near Alpine Road and Mindego Hill Road. ...Emergency crews had to hike for nearly hour, through rugged, heavily forested terrain, to reach the victims. Helicopters were needed to transport them to a hospital...”

Pescadero Man Dies after Driving off Highway 1

“A 66-year-old driver from Pescadero sent his truck careening off Highway 1 and onto Montara State Beach on early Sunday morning after he suffered a sudden fatal heart attack. The driver, identified as Pescadero farmer John Lawrence Castagnetto, was traveling north on Highway 1 just north of the La Costanera restaurant, when he veered into the oncoming lane traffic and continued driving off the road. The truck eventually landed more than 700 feet away down the beach cliff in a small creek bed... A lifelong farmer, Castagnetto owned and operated a 20-acre family ranch in Pescadero, where he grew mixed vegetables...”

Neighbor appeals San Gregorio property plans

“A San Gregorio resident’s request to subdivide a 12.4-acre parcel and develop one of the lots would create substandard parcels and misuse prime agricultural land, an appellant to the project claims. San Mateo County Planning Commission approved key planning documents in October, but the property owner’s neighbor appealed the project to the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors shortly afterward. The San Gregorio General Store and post office are on the parcel located within the rural service center on Stage Road in San Gregorio. The parcel’s current zoning is split between Planned Agricultural District and Neighborhood Commercial. The property owners, George and Mary Cattermole, propose separating the commercial-zoned section and then splitting it into three parcels, including two homes and a detached garage... The parcel has existing problems with septic drain fields, according to appellants Shauna McKenna and David Rhodes...”

Portola State Park on Closure List

"Portola Redwoods State Park has always been known as a place where you can hike for miles without seeing anyone.



But that feature of the park could also be considered a drawback, since low attendance may have triggered the state's decision to list Portola Redwoods among the 70 state parks headed for closing in 2012.

It's not as big or as popular as Big Basin Redwoods State Park a few miles away, but locals love Portola Redwoods' curvy, sun-dappled trails, hidden waterfalls and towering redwood groves that climb the hills of this 2,600-acre forest canyon..."Even though it's so close to Silicon Valley, it's very remote," said David Crane, a **La Honda** resident who grew up camping in Portola Redwoods State Park with his parents and now brings his family there. "You run into very few people. I really love that there are spots you can get away and you aren't in a crowded situation." ...the state's announcement Friday that the park will be padlocked no later than July 2012, along with 69 others, in order to comply with an order to cut \$11 million from the state parks budget this coming fiscal year and \$22 million next year...Portola Redwoods is the only state park in San Mateo County that made the list this time around..."

KPDO Tunes into New Leaders, Strategy

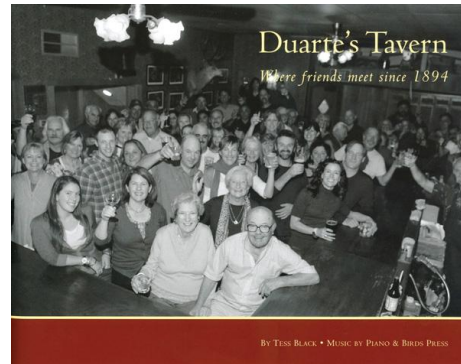

"Leaders at Pescadero's burgeoning radio station, KPDO, say they have dumped Daniel Roberts as station manager approximately six months after the radio veteran abruptly left the country. KPDO founder and board president Maggie Celeste Worden announced on Thursday that she would take over Roberts' unpaid role as the station works to re-establish itself in the South Coast community. The Pescadero station

celebrated its one-year anniversary earlier this month, however, it's been a bumpy road. Roberts' leadership style reportedly turned off some volunteers and donors. The problems facing the station culminated in November when Roberts departed without much explanation or warning..."

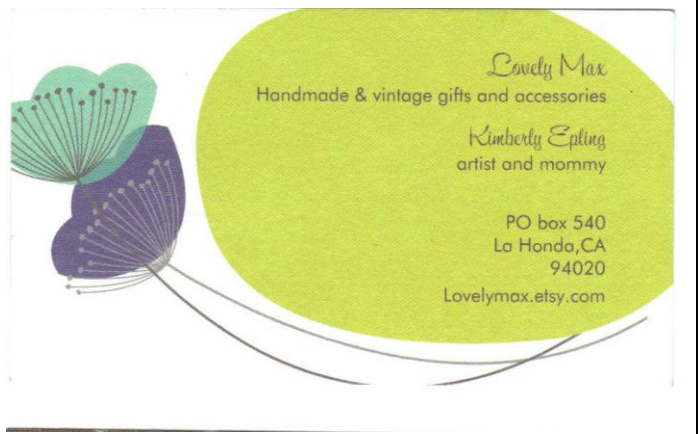
